

DREVIEW

Hubert Duprat

Aquatic caddisfly larvae make their protective metamorphic sheaths from silk thread, stones, twigs, leaves and whatever else is available. But take those things away and give them grains of gold dust, pearls, rubies and diamonds and they're quite happy to get on with the job. That's what French artist Hubert Duprat has been doing since 1983, among making other sculptural works that similarly evoke the nexus between art, science and nature. "The work is a collaborative effort between me and the caddis larvae; I create the conditions necessary for the caddis to display their talents," Duprat has said.

Science, biology and organic processes are subjects dear to the hearts of MONA and its founder David Walsh. Ongoing exhibition <u>The Red Queen</u>, which ends 21 April, takes Lewis Carroll's character and her habit of running but never passing anything as a his other sculptural creations. "Materials not metaphor for evolutionary behaviour to ask: is art just a biological impulse?

Which Duprat's caddisflies perhaps suggest. "Hubert Duprat co-opts nature in his art. He uses caddisflies to make his art. But they don't make his art, they make their art," Walsh says. MONA senior curator Olivier Varenne sees a parallel between the caddisfly works and Duprat's use of skilled craftsmen to realise his other sculptural creations. "Materials not usually found in 'fine art' – ranging from modelling clay to crystals – are employed to create improbable forms. His great interest in natural phenomena and his vast knowledge are combined to create art that is truly unique," Varenne says. The exhibition forms part of the MONA FOMA festival, which runs from 15 to


